3. Administrative Items

The meeting was called to order at 6:31 p.m. Reed Hodgin, facilitator, welcomed everyone to the Zoom virtual meeting. He reviewed the ground rules and draft agenda. He explained that if anyone would like to speak during the meeting, please use the raise hand icon and someone will acknowledge your request.

Doon Gibbs, Laboratory Director, welcomed everyone and expressed his best wishes for their continued safety and health.

Jack Anderson, Deputy Director for Operations, gave the CAC an update on the COVID-19 response at the Lab. He said New York State has four "Phases" of Recovery. The federal government has a similar model but consisting of just three "Phases". The general intent is the same – a gradual, evidence-driven resumption of operations. We've been very slowly reintroducing staff back to the Lab and are currently at about 60% of staff teleworking and 40% working onsite (roughly about 1,000 people).

Hodgin said the past year was a challenge for attendance at CAC meetings, especially with the occurrence of the COVID-19 pandemic. In response, he proposed an administrative motion to waive its requirement that members attend 2/3 of the regular CAC meetings for the previous year. This suspension would only apply to the 12-month period from September 2019 through August 2020. The requirement for attendance at 2/3 of meetings during a 12-month period would resume with the September 2020 CAC meeting.

A vote was held and the motion to suspend the requirement for 2/3 meeting attendance for the past 12-month period was passed with 16 in favor, 1 opposed and 1 abstention.

Member Esposito objected to the virtual meeting process of muting all attendees and then unmuting them if they raise their virtual hands. The process was then changed so that all attendees could mute or unmute themselves as desired. Hodgin asked that members continue to raise their virtual hands if they want to speak.

Hodgin then said that Member Sprintzen has requested that his position on the CAC be changed to Emeritus.

A vote was held and the motion to convert Member Sprintzen to an Emeritus position was passed with 16 in favor, 1 opposed and 1 abstention.

The June 2020 draft notes were reviewed and approved with 19 in favor, none opposed and one abstention.

4. Environmental Updates

Paul Lucas, Department of Energy Office of Environmental Management, updated the CAC on the Demolition and Decommissioning of the High Flux Beam Reactor (HFBR) stack.

Doug Paquette, Brookhaven National Laboratory, spoke about the emerging contaminants of concern/private well sampling survey status. He updated the CAC on the status of PFAS and 1,4 Dioxane.

Member Corrarino asked if the Department of Health could provide a written breakdown of all the properties that have received a request to have their wells sampled along with the number of those that responded and the results.

Andy Rapiejko said he would get that information to the Lab so they can share it with the CAC. He said please realize this information is constantly being updated and the numbers change quite often.

Jason Remien, Brookhaven National Laboratory, spoke about the first phase of the Building 650 demolition project.

5. Electron Ion Collider, Jim Yeck - Project Director, EIC

Bob Tribble introduced Jim Yeck, Project Director for the Electron Ion Collider (EIC) project. Jim provided an overview of the EIC project for the CAC.

6. Environmental Assessment for the Electron Ion Collider, Tim Green – Natural & Cultural Resources, Manager

Tim Green briefed the CAC about the Environmental Assessment for the EIC. He described the NEPA process and explained the alternatives that are being evaluated, as well as next steps in the process.

7. Agenda Setting

David Manning said that at the next meeting on October 8th we will have a presentation on the 2019 Site Environmental Report as well as more environmental updates on the Stack, Bldg. 650 and PFAS. If the CAC has any questions or comments, please send an email to Robyn. If you have any requests for future agenda topics, please send them to us also.

Member Ziems requested more information on Solar Energy in the future.

Member Krupski thanked Member Sprintzen for his commitment to the CAC.
