# 3. Administrative Items

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm. Reed Hodgin, facilitator, reviewed the ground rules and the agenda. Those in attendance introduced themselves.

Hodgin gave a short presentation on his granddaughter's science fair project about shadows.

#### Approval of Minutes

Hodgin asked for corrections, additions, or deletions to the November 14, 2013 draft notes. The notes were approved as written with none opposed and four abstentions.

# 4. SPDES Permit Modification Update, Jason Remien – Interim Division Manager, Environmental Protection Division

Remien reported that a Notice of Complete Application for modifications to the Lab's SPDES Permit was published in Newsday on Thursday, November 21, 2013 and comments are due by 12/21/13. He said the modification to the permit includes relocation of the STP discharge from the Peconic River to groundwater via recharge beds – a project that has been ongoing since 2009. The draft SPDES permit with the proposed effluent limits and monitoring requirements is available for review at the NYSDEC Region 1 Office in Stony Brook.

Remien explained that groundwater monitoring has been added to the draft permit, mercury minimization program requirements will be removed, a requirement has been added for a short term monitoring program for PCBs and pesticides, and the Water Treatment Chemical (WTC) requirements page has been updated to list the current WTCs used and approved at BNL.

The contract for the STP Design Modifications has been awarded to SECECA, SCMC, LLC. Construction is expected to start in September 2013 and be completed by Spring 2014.

**5.** Activated Graphene Presentation, Eric Stach – Center for Functional Nanomaterials Stach spoke about the reasons new materials are needed for energy storage and the different technologies. He talked about capacitors, supercapacitors, graphene, graphene oxide (GO), and microwave exfoliated graphene oxide (MEGO).

Member Blumer asked what the next steps are.

Stach said filing a patent and starting a company. We are still learning more.

Hodgin asked if Stach would return with an update on his research.

Stach agreed to return.

#### 7. Agenda Setting

Hodgin said that Tim Green will give a presentation in January on natural resource management. There will also be a presentation on the DOE BHSO utilities service contract and a discussion on membership. The presentation on the status of cleanup activities will be on the agenda for February.

#### 8. Annual Groundwater Update, Bill Dorsch, Groundwater Protection Group

Dorsch gave an update on the status of the groundwater cleanup. He spoke about regulatory approval of system shutdowns for 2013, current Volatile Organic Compound (VOC) groundwater issues, progress in recent VOC groundwater remedies, and the status of Tritium/Strontium-90 plumes. He reported that from 1996 to 2012 21 billion gallons of contaminated groundwater have been treated and recharged to the aquifer, 6,950 lbs of VOCs have been removed, and 27 mCi of Strontium-90 have been removed.

Dorsch explained the shutdown process. He said the groundwater treatment system completion process begins when plume capture goals are reached for a system. The regulators are then petitioned for system shutdown. Upon approval, the extraction wells are turned off and maintained in a standby mode with the wells being sampled for several years. If no rebound in VOC concentrations is observed, the regulators are petitioned for system closure. Upon approval, the equipment is decommissioned, the wells are abandoned, and there is continued limited monitoring. The following systems are closed: OU IV Air Sparge/Soil Vapor Extraction, Carbon Tetrachloride Pump and Treat, and the Industrial Park East Pump and Treat. The following systems are shutdown: OU I South Boundary, Industrial Park, North Street, and HFBR Tritium Pump and Recharge.

Dorsch showed maps with the status of the Building 96 VOC Plume Source Area and the Building 452 Freon-11 plume. He showed detailed cross-section maps of several of the plumes and showed sequential maps showing the reduction in size of the plumes over time. He said a new extraction well was installed for OU III Middle Rd. Treatment System and shut down of North Street East Treatment System is planned for 2014. The Laboratory will continue to keep regulators and the community stakeholders informed about cleanup progress, issues, and the results of 2014 planned activities.

Member Esposito said this presentation should have been given first. The reason the CAC was created was to address environmental issues, not to hear science presentations.

Hodgin said the Laboratory will take note of her concern.

Member Heil asked how Freon-11 is removed.

Dorsch said it is pumped and then air stripped.

Member Esposito asked if the filters clog often.

Dorsch said no.

Member Giacomaro asked why soil was removed at Building 96. Was something missed?

Dorsch said nothing was missed, but we determined it to be a continuing source, so the contaminated soil was removed.

The meeting adjourned at 8:59 p.m.
