Library staffing reduced by 0.5 FTE, so down to 1 FTE. In the process of a search for new Scientific Publications Coordinator. There has been no significant change to library budget.

While the LBNL Library has been under IT at large for the past decade, it is now under Science Services division of IT. We are now in with Scientific Computing and Scientific Consulting.

- 4) Due to break down in negotiations between UC system and Elsevier, LBNL will have the eventual loss of 2019 Elsevier journal titles. This will most probably result in an increase the amount of ILL borrowing/Document Delivery requests we will receive.
- 5) Determining the extent of data management services the Library provides.

- 1) Expand research data management services.
- 2) Providing outreach and training in SciVal, InCites, etc.

- 1) LBNL is in a consortial agreement with University of California Berkeley. This allows our researchers to request books and articles found in their collections. Over the past few months, the number of books requested have gone up considerably. Possibly due to continuing education activities.
- 2) Open Access It will and is already disrupting publishing workflows. Plan S and Elsevier vs. UC, Germany, Hungary, Sweden, etc. and the impact on researchers and libraries.
- 3) The LBNL Library budget is stable
- 4) Adding new Nature titles, even though we said we were not going to.
