Budget and staffing changes – discuss any substantial or significant changes in library budget or staffing since last annual meeting and the expected impact on your library/organization.

- Reduced budget for FY19 resulted in elimination of a few subscriptions
- Addition of one FTE to Library Reports Management Team
- Budget has been stabilized for 2020; looking to have budget stabilized for out-years to
 include subscription inflation costs; appear to have upper management support for the
 continuation of core subscription content.

Organizational changes – discuss any changes in your immediate or organizational mission or management structure and the expected impact on your library/organization.

- NM Library moved out of IT, from reporting up through to CIO, to now reporting to CRO
 Research & Academic Groups up through to CRO. Now directly aligned with research
 community that Library products and services support.
- Some NM site personnel have been reorganized to now report to CA Division; this has shifted some NM Library costs from NM Service Level Agreement to CA Service Level Agreement

Current initiatives – discuss significant library initiatives, accomplishments, awards or collaborations (internal or external). These can be on any topic including library operations, projects, research and development, physical space, just cool stuff, etc.

- Completed investment project to digitize NM Library's Central Technical File (CTF) collection of internal legacy grey literature; over 1M pages
- Completion of successful pilot of born-digital grey literature capture and collection
- Completed successful redesign of Library website, with deployment on external cloud platform using Libguides CMS; partnered with IT, Cyber and Classification to make this happen

- Completed RFQ for automated article/document request services (aka document-delivery).
 RightFind won competitive bid over Reprints Desk, primarily due to technology and integration with Sandia processes; transaction pricing reduced 50% and platform/licensing fees reduced 72%
- FY19 Koha ILS evaluation if positive, will move off Horizon ILS to a Koha deployment
- FY19 initiative to expand born-digital grey literature capture and collection beyond pilot to Advanced Science & Technology Division and/or enterprise
- FY19 initiative to engage and partner with Office of Research and Development Integrity in support of high-integrity, high-quality research and development at Sandia; this with primary responsibility for instituting an internal peer-review process and application as part of the Review & Approval process that focuses on information review for sensitivities (most likely to occur post-FY19).

Challenges – discuss any issues or situations, not already mentioned above, affecting your library in the past year and how they were addressed or planned to be addressed.

- Subscription budget sustainability: Working with upper management and finance to budget for out-year subscriptions, with inclusion of inflation factor; incorporate costing into CRO Service Level Agreement to Labs
- Public Access submissions: R&A compliance, incomplete/incorrect metadata and/or incorrect manuscript versions continue to be R&A issues impacting OSTI submission rates Continue to iterate on technology and processes to increase submissions through automation and reduced manual intervention; engage leadership and management in Review & Approval; Conducted Structured Improvement Activity around R&A
- Significant increase in requests for reports literature, including for SAND reports and external reports held in collection: Streamlining access to reports with limitations; hire FTE for Reports Management
- Continued changes in Classified Matter Protection & Control Management and personnel are resulting in having to continually educate new and shifted CMPC folks on NM Library Reports Management

Future initiatives – discuss ideas, proposals or plans you may have for the immediate or strategic future of your library and the expected impact on your organization.

- Renew investigation and evaluation of potential metadata extraction tools that can handle unstructured, unformated text, including written
- Deployment of Koha on high-side

- Continued Lab focus on operations, finances & cost-savings (i.e. way prepays are handled)

- Lab focus of information security; cloud becomes more complex
